Our January club meeting will feature a display on winter seed sowing in a milk bottle. It may never have occurred to you that even in our climate you can sow seeds outside in winter in their own mini greenhouses that you build yourself from recyclable plastic milk jugs. You'll be rewarded with plants ready for spring planting. Monica Foley will bring a sample milk jug with seeds to the January meeting to display on the back table including instructions and a list of seeds that can you can use for this method of germination. plant sale in June. The workshop will conclude with herbal teas and a sampling of foods using herbs. Members of the Horticulture Committee will provide the goodies but anyone with a special herb recipe is invited to contribute to the party. There will also be samples of an herbal oil and scrub for the skin with directions on how to make them. There is no charge, but please sign up in advance so we can plan for seating and food.
